If you would like to join us for **in-person worship**, we gather on Sundays for a **10:00 a.m. service in the Sanctuary** and the **4:00 p.m. Jazz at Four service in Buchanan Chapel.** * Worship can be heard through **hearing aids' "T" or "T-coil" setting. * Please** silence electronic devices when in the Chapel. * The **doors open for worship** on Sundays a half hour before each service. For the 4:00 service, access is only by the Delaware doors to the Gratz Center. *** Sunday parking** is available at 900 N. Michigan (*access from Rush or Walton*) at the rate of \$9 for 6 hours between 7:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. (*and* \$18 for up to 12 hours). Validation tickets for the garage must be picked up from an usher. *** For those who prefer to worship online** or are unable to join us in person, we livestream our morning service on our YouTube channel (*www.bit.ly/fpcvideos*).

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On Wednesdays we gather for **Morning Prayer via Zoom** at 9:30 a.m. and for **in-person Morning Prayer** at 10:00 a.m. in Buchanan Chapel.
