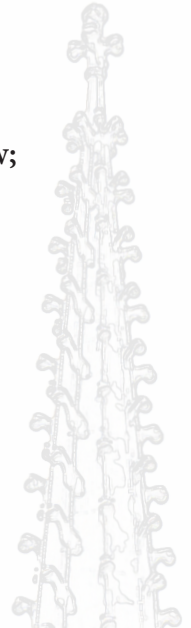

Welcome!

We are glad to be worshipping with you today and invite you to continue to join us at this intersection of faith and life as we share God’s grace with one another and the world through worship and ministries of healing, reconciliation, and justice. ✨ Inspired by the radical hospitality of Jesus Christ, we welcome everyone, without exception, into the life of this congregation!

Joining us in person

If you like to join us for **in-person worship**, we typically gather at 9:30 and 11:00 a.m. and 2:00 p.m. However, please note that we will have **only one morning service next Sunday, December 31, and it will be at 10:00 a.m. (and also livestreamed)**. Our 2:00 service will not be held today or on December 31 but will resume on Sunday, January 7. ✨ On Sundays the **doors open for worship** a half hour prior to each service. There are three fully accessible entrances, without steps, that lead to the Sanctuary: on Michigan Avenue (*through the glass Loggia doors between the courtyard and the main Sanctuary doors*); at 126 E. Chestnut; and at 115 E. Delaware. ✨ **Sunday parking** is available at 900 N. Michigan (*access from Rush or Walton*) at the rate of \$9 for 6 hours (*and \$18 for up to 12 hours*) and at the Hancock garage (875 N. Michigan, *enter from Delaware or Chestnut*) at the rate of \$10 between 8:00 a.m. and 2:00 p.m. Validation tickets for the garages must be picked up from an usher. ✨ **Worship can be heard** through “T” or “T-coil” settings of hearing aids. ✨ Please silence **electronic devices** during worship.

Joining us online

Each Sunday our worshipping body is a wonderful mix of those online, on the phone, and in the pews. For those who prefer to worship online or who are unable to join us in person, **this Sunday and December 31 we will be streaming the 10:00 a.m. service** on our YouTube channel (www.bit.ly/fpcvideos), where it can be viewed any time after the service begins. (*For tips on how to watch—from the beginning—a service that is already in progress, see fourthchurch.org/watch-from-the-beginning*) We will also be streaming our **8:00 p.m. Christmas Eve Lessons and Carols service** tonight. When our regular schedule resumes on January 7, we will return to livestreaming our 9:30 a.m. and 2:00 p.m. services. ✨ **Those without Internet access** are invited to listen via phone by calling 888.916.9166 at 10:00 a.m. today and next Sunday as well as 8:00 p.m. this evening.

Joining us with children

Children are always welcome in worship! **If you need to step out to comfort your child**, the Hospitality Suite, on the second floor of the Gratz Center, is a quiet space for families where worship is livestreamed. During Sunday morning services **nursery care** is available on the fourth floor of the Gratz Center for infants through two-year-olds. ✨ Please note that while there is nursery care this morning, there will be **no nursery care this afternoon or evening during the Christmas Eve services or on Christmas Day**. Children are invited to be with their parents in worship for those services.

Please let us know you are here by filling out an information form. Those worshipping with us via livestream will find **a link to the online form**—which takes only 20 seconds to complete!—included in the descriptive text below the video (*after exiting full-screen view*); a QR code is also displayed during the “Welcome and Announcements” that can be scanned with a phone camera to take you to the form. Those worshipping with us in person are asked to use the **information pads in the pews**, passing them down the pew so worshipers have opportunity to greet one another by name following the service.

Christmas Eve

We hope you will join us later today and tomorrow in celebrating the birth of Christ! We will gather for **four candlelight Christmas Eve services** this afternoon and evening: the **Christmas Eve Children's Pageant** at 4:00 p.m.; **Family Service** at 6:00 p.m., and **Lessons and Carols** at 8:00 p.m. (*also livestreamed*) and 10:00 p.m. ✨ For Christmas Eve services, entry will be through the glass Loggia doors next to the courtyard on Michigan Avenue. **Seating will begin** at 3:15 p.m. for the Pageant; seating for the other three services will begin forty-five to thirty minutes prior to the start of each service. ✨ **Discounted parking** for today's afternoon and evening services will be available at the 900 N. Michigan garage only, at the rate of \$9 for 6 hours (*and \$18 for up to 12 hours*).

Christmas Day

Tomorrow on **Christmas morning** we will gather again for a joyous service of worship at 10:00 a.m. ✨ Discounted **Christmas Day parking** will be available at the 900 N. Michigan garage only and will cost \$20. Parking validations can be purchased in the Commons tomorrow morning prior to returning to the garage. ✨ We will not be livestreaming the Christmas Day service. Instead we invite those looking for an **online option on Christmas Day** to view the Christmas Eve service from tonight or any of our past seasonal offerings available on YouTube (www.bit.ly/fpcvideos). We will also be sharing there tomorrow morning a brief **Christmas "Rhythm and Word" video**, offering a time of scripture, music, and reflection for Christmas Day.

New Year's Eve

Next **Sunday, December 31**, we will have **just one morning worship service, at 10:00 a.m.** (*also livestreamed*). We will then gather in our Sanctuary with neighbors and our friends from Holy Name Cathedral at 6:30 p.m. for a candlelit **New Year's Eve Taizé service** (*in person only*). This Taizé service offers moving music, space for prayer, and meditative pause for reflecting on the year past and looking ahead to the year to come. (*The 2:00 p.m. service will not be held today or on New Year's Eve but will resume on January 7. Our schedule of two morning worship services will resume on January 7 as well.*)
