Chicago Shares voucher booklets are available at the Mission table during Coffee Hour.

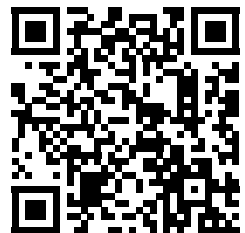
