

Reminding us of the unity in that global family, the colorful cloth on the Communion Table and the stoles being worn by the pastors are from Guatemala, and the banner hanging from the pulpit was created to give to the First Presbyterian Church in Havana, Cuba, to celebrate our fifteen-year partnership in ministry with our sister congregation.

THE AFFIRMATION OF FAITH is excerpted from the Belhar Confession of the Uniting Reformed Church in Southern Africa and has been approved for inclusion in the Book of Confessions of the Presbyterian Church (USA).
