

### Worship Notes

Today is Reformation Sunday, a day when we recall the rich heritage of the Protestant tradition. The Presbyterian Church (USA) grew out of the Reformation of the sixteenth century under leaders such as John Calvin and John Knox. It was on October 31, 1517, that Martin Luther posted his ninety-five theses on the church door in Wittenberg, Germany, the watershed event sparking the Reformation. Luther later authored the hymn "A Mighty Fortress Is Our God," sung early in today's service and featured in the Postlude. Reformation Sunday is also a day when we remember and give thanks for Reformation leaders and all others who have kept the faith.
