

Worship Notes

COMES AUTUMN TIME, this morning's postlude, premiered at Fourth Presbyterian Church on October 24, 1916, almost exactly one hundred years ago. Leo Sowerby was twenty-one years old when he wrote this piece for Eric DeLamarter, Organist and Director of Music at Fourth Church from 1914 to 1935. This piece launched Sowerby's career as a prolific composer, and he went on to write more than eighty works for the organ. "Comes Autumn Time" was later performed by the Chicago Symphony Orchestra.

THE BULLETIN COVER IMAGE depicts fallen leaves on the stairs in the Michigan Avenue courtyard. The cover quote is from Dietrich Bonhoeffer's 1939 book *Life Together.*
