humbling the monuments to human pride, giving voice to those who have no voice;

a sign of those who point the way to Christ, who overturn false ways,

who live by the values of God.

(Three candles are lit)

Leader 2: These point to the Light of Christ:

Leader 1: As the prophet foresaw: the people who walked in shadows have seen a great light.

The light has shined on those who lived in a place of deep shadows.

You have increased their joy.

Leader 2: To turn away from you, Lord, is to turn to the shadows.

Leader: In the dark, longings for love and birth arise.

All: Come to us in our longings.

Dispel from our faith the shadows of sin and ignorance.

All: Amen.

Advent

The Festival of Advent Lessons and Music will take place today at 6:30 p.m. in the Sanctuary. A cookies-and-cocoa reception will follow in Anderson Hall. (There will be no discounted parking after 6:00 p.m.)

The Jazz at Four Christmas celebration will be next Sunday, December 18 at 4:00 p.m.; music will begin at 3:50 p.m. The worship service that afternoon will feature selections from *Singing Christmas*, the latest CD by the Lucy Smith Quartet. A post-service gathering will be held in Borwell Dining Room. (The 4:00 jazz service will not be held on December 25 or January 1 but will resume on January 8.)

The "Longest Night" service, which will be held Wednesday, December 21 at 6:30 p.m. in Buchanan Chapel, recognizes the feelings of loneliness, grief, and alienation that are often present during the holiday season.

Four candlelight services will be held on Christmas Eve: 4:00 p.m. (Children's Pageant); 6:00 p.m. (Family Service); and 8:30 and 11:00 p.m. (Service of Lessons and Carols). The Christmas Day service will be at 11:00 a.m.

Parking rates for Christmas Eve: For those entering the 900 garage before 5:00 p.m. on December 24, discounted parking will cost \$17, which is the holiday rate. The \$17 parking voucher for that discount will need to be purchased at Fourth Church on Christmas Eve—cash or check only—and will be available before and after the Children's Pageant that day. Those entering the garage after 5:00 p.m. on Christmas Eve will be able to park for the usual \$8 evening rate with an evening voucher available at the church. There will be no discounted parking at the Hancock garage on Christmas Eve.

During Today's Worship

All are encouraged to use the prayer card, found in this worship bulletin, to offer joys and/or concerns. The cards will be collected during the Sharing of Gifts (simply place the card in the offering plate as it is passed). The prayers will then be read aloud during this afternoon's Prayers of the People.

If you have a prayer you would rather not share during worship, you are invited to complete a prayer card found by one of the prayer boxes in the Narthex, at the back of the Sanctuary, and it will be passed on to Judith Watt, Associate Pastor for Pastoral Care.

All, including children, are invited to the Lord's Table

to receive Communion, which is served by intinction. The congregation will come forward by the center aisle to receive the bread (gluten-free bread is available in the paper "cup" within the basket of bread), which they will then dip into the chalice of nonalcoholic grape juice. Worshipers will return to their pews by the side aisles.

The large banners hanging in the middle of the Sanctuary were created by liturgical artist Shawna Bowman during the 4:00 worship service and are artistic representations of our worship experience.

Please silence all electronic devices when in the Sanctuary.

Worship also can be heard through the "T" setting of hearing aids.

If your infant or small child needs care during the worship service, you may leave the Sanctuary and return as you wish. There is also an area in the left-side aisle where your child can play quietly.
