

Worship Notes

THE "LIGHT UP A LIFE" OFFERING is being received throughout Advent. TODAY'S CHRISTMAS CANTATA was composed by Daniel Pinkham in 1957 while he was teaching at Harvard. To best appreciate this music the listener should become a character in the Christmas story. The first movement begins by asking the shepherds what they saw followed by the shepherds' frantic and somewhat chaotic reply about "a child and a chorus of angels." The second movement depicts the wonder and tranquility of the manger scene. The final movement begins softly and builds throughout, portraying the joyful coming of Christ into our hearts and into the world. As the third movement begins, the angel chorus is in the distance singing "Gloria in excelsis Deo," but the exultation grows with each reiteration of the chorus.
