**Chicago Lights Tutoring**, which encourages 400 students living in under-resourced neighborhoods to graduate from high school and pursue higher education and meaningful careers.

**Fourth Church Meals Ministry**, which distributes bag lunches each week, Tuesday through Thursday, to 200 people and serves a hot meal to approximately 130 guests on both Sunday and Monday nights.

## Worship Notes

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EACH SUNDAY DURING LENT we are extinguishing a candle at the front of the Sanctuary. Just as we lit candles on the Advent wreath to symbolize the light coming into the world through the birth of Christ, so now our extinguishing of candles points to the Lenten progression from light to the shadows of Good Friday and the crucifixion.

THE BULLETIN COVER IMAGE depicts the chancel in Buchanan Chapel before the hanging sculpture was installed, with shadows from the windows forming crosses on the limestone floor by the baptismal font. The cover quote is from the book *Action in Waiting* by Christoph Friedrich Blumhardt (1842–1919).
