breaking the power of sin and evil,


delivering us from death to life eternal.

Worship Notes

TODAY IS EPIPHANY, the twelfth day of Christmas. *Epiphany* is a Greek word meaning “appearance,” “manifestation,” or “coming to light.” On this day we remember the magi following the light of the star to worship Jesus as king of all people.
