

The congregation is served in the pews by Fourth Church elders and deacons.

The congregation also takes on the role of serving: worshipers take the bread (which is glutenfree) and grape juice from the plate held by their neighbor, and then they take the plate and serve the neighbor on their other side. Empty glasses are placed in the ringed holes in the pew racks.

THE CHANCEL AND MORNING CHOIRS are singing antiphonally from the north and south balconies this morning, performing (in German) music intended to be sung by two choirs in separate locations.
