We are glad to have you with us today and hope you will explore the many opportunities for learning, serving, and community building at Fourth Church! * Inspired by the radical hospitality of Jesus Christ, we welcome everyone, without exception, into the life of this congregation. * We invite you to join us at this intersection of faith and life as we share God's grace with one another and the world through worship and ministries of healing, reconciliation, and justice.



Our "Big Questions" sermon series continues today by exploring "Are we saved?" Next Sunday, May 19 we will wrestle with "How can we be church with differing political views?" * We will then take a break in the series on Sunday, May 26 to welcome Father Elias Chacour to the pulpit at 9:30 and 11:00 a.m. Father Chacour, author of Blood Brothers, is internationally known for his work for reconciliation between Palestinians and Jews.



In addition to our Sunday morning services, we also **come together as a worshiping community** on Sunday afternoons for a 4:00 p.m. jazz Communion service in Buchanan Chapel. (If you are interested in serving as a greeter to welcome Jazz at Four worshipers, please let us know!) * On Wednesdays we gather for **Morning Prayer**, an opportunity to pray for members and those in need.



Summer Sunday School, which will be in session during June and July at 9:30 a.m. only, begins on June 2. (There will be no Sunday School on May 19 or 26.) * Also on our calendar of summer activities for children is our annual Family Night Drive-In Movie at the church on Friday, June 14 and a fun-filled week of Vacation Bible School, which this summer takes us to ancient Greece with the Apostle Paul, on the mornings of August 5–9. (VBS registration is now open!) * Another way to support the faith journey of our youth is to sign up to be an adult leader for junior and senior high programs during the 2019–2020 program year. We need chaperones for retreats as well as leaders to assist with Sunday morning youth groups and Confirmation circles.



Preschoolers and their families are invited to enjoy a time of play and exploration at our **Day School open house** this Saturday morning, May 18 from 9:30 to 11:00 a.m. * For those interested in our weekday preschool, the **Day School is accepting applications** for the 2019–2020 school year.



Each third Sunday of May we mark **Dedication Commemoration Sunday**, remembering the dedication of our Sanctuary in May 1914. This year our observance will pair with "**Leave a Legacy Sunday**." At Coffee Hour on Sunday, May 19 you will find information about how to remember the church in your will or as a beneficiary in your life insurance.



We have several **musical treats** in store for you this week! As part of our **free Friday Noonday series**, Fourth Church Choir member **Laura Perkett** will present a soprano and oboe concert. * That Friday evening, May 17, at 7:30 p.m. Tower Brass and the Fourth Church Choral Society will present their spring concert, which will feature **John Rutter's Gloria**. (A freewill offering will be received at the door.) * Then on Saturday, May 18 at 7:30 p.m., **Bella Voce** will present works by Handel, Purcell, and Vivaldi in Buchanan Chapel. (*Tickets are available online or at the door.*)



In addition to our **daily devotions**, we offer several other resources for **meditation and reflection**. Each Tuesday, we begin the day with time set apart for **Sacred Pause** meditation, twenty minutes of silence in Stone Chapel at 7:45 a.m. * We then end the day with **Tuesday evening meditation**, hosted by our Replogle Center for Counseling and Well-Being, at 7:00 p.m. * Another opportunity for meditation, "**Yoga for Managing Stress and Mood**" meets this Wednesday, May 15 at 7:15 p.m. in the Boyle Conference Room. * On Thursday, May 23 at 5:30 p.m., **Women at Fourth** will hold a program on contemplative prayer, and our monthly candlelit **Taizé service** will take place Friday, May 24 at 7:30 p.m., with opportunity to take part in a labyrinth walk beforehand (between 6:00 and 7:30 p.m).



If you are looking for **ways to connect** with others here at Fourth Church or in the community, we invite you to find a program or event that matches your interests or has you curious. Perhaps you would like to take part in a book group conversation, sign up for a three-month Bible study, or join us in gardening!
