Getting to Fourth Church during the Chicago Marathon Sunday, October 8, 2023 MAJOR ROUTES THAT WILL BE OPEN Marathon route (road closed to traffic) Depending on the progress of the race, the marathon route often cannot be crossed except where dotted lines are shown on map!

Mass transit: All CTA rail lines and Metra operations will be running on their normal Sunday schedules. Various CTA buses will be rerouted around street closures.

Parking: Both the Hancock and 900 N. Michigan garages will be accessible as usual, with the standard Sunday parking rates (discounted with Fourth Church validation).

All expressways will remain open, as will all entrances and exits to them (except the Dan Ryan ramps at 35th St.).

Michigan Avenue will be open continuously north of Roosevelt Road (1200 South), although the Roosevelt-Michigan intersection (at 1200 South) will be closed.

The entire length of "Outer" Lake Shore Drive will be open, although exits and entrances at Addison, Fullerton, and Roosevelt will not be accessible and the Inner Drive will be closed from Addison to Belmont. The on/off ramps at North Avenue will remain open, but only to access opposite-direction ramps and the Inner Drive. The North Avenue/LaSalle spur is closed west of the Inner Drive; the Inner Drive will remain open from North Avenue all the way to its terminus at Oak Street.

The **Chicago Avenue** exit/entrance from and to southbound Lake Shore Drive will remain open. (If coming from the south, note that Lake Shore Drive is likely to be congested as it passes the Start/Finish area of Grant Park.)

Clark and **Dearborn** are open from 1600 North south to the Loop. **State** is open from 1600 North south to Grand, closed from Grand south to Jackson, and open from Congress south to 32nd St.
