For over twenty years the AWOL event has welcomed youth to gather, worship and engage in mission. This event is sponsored by the Presbytery of Chicago Youth Ministry Team (a collection of youth workers and ministers from churches within the Presbytery of Chicago.)

The group will stay overnight at First Presbyterian Church on Friday. We start off with a pizza dinner at 6:30 p.m. (Breakfast and lunch on Saturday will also be provided). On Saturday, we travel to our mission site. The group will return to First Presbyterian Church and finish by 5:00 p.m. on Saturday.

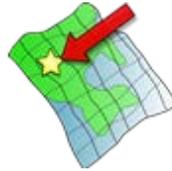

A Basic Packing List



What to Bring:

- Sleeping bag and pillow
- Sleepwear (pajamas, slippers, etc.)
- Bible, notebook and pens
- Comfortable clothes for indoors (perhaps some dancing gym shoes)
- Warm clothes for outdoors
- Shoes / boots (indoor and outdoor)
- A coat or jacket (hat and gloves if needed)
- Towel and personal items (soap, shampoo, toothbrush and paste, etc.)
- Flashlight with batteries
- Your medications, as needed (your adult leader must be aware of all medications)
- Work gloves (gloves for gardening should be fine)
- Camera, cards, group games
- A great attitude!



DO NOT Bring:

- Cell phones, iPods, personal computers or any other form of electronics that would entice others to borrow it (permanently) from you or cause you (or others) to be distracted from group activities.
- Anything of great value (jewelry, tons of money, etc.)
- Anything that could be harmful to yourself or to another person (knives, fireworks, alcohol, drugs, aerosols, etc.)
- Anything inappropriate for a church retreat
