

Worship Notes: Fourth Church welcomes guest soloist Anne-Marie Spalinger from Atlanta, Georgia, and Schola Cantorum de Caracas, under the direction of Ana María Raga, to worship this morning.

John Baillie, who is quoted on the cover of this bulletin, was an outstanding Scottish theologian and served as Moderator of the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland and President of the World Council of Churches. He preached from the pulpit of Fourth Presbyterian Church on March 16, 1941.

The 9:30 and 11:00 postlude is based on today's gospel reading, in which Jesus says, "You are Peter, and on this rock I will build my church, and the gates of Hades will not prevail against it." Henri Mulet (1878-1967) depicts the sinister forces and "gates of Hades" through the melody and fast-moving chords. The oppressive qualities of the music try to "prevail" as they build to an intense climax. The shifts from minor to major and from chords to arpeggios symbolize release from the "gates of Hades." Thus in the final seconds of the piece, Peter clearly does prevail.
