### Worship Notes

**The Easter banners and paraments** convey the Easter joy of the resurrection. The paraments on the Communion Table and pulpit were designed by Eliza Linley; the banners are the work of Nancy Chinn.

**The needlepoint panels and cross** installed in the chancel in time for Easter were conceived and stitched by Morgan Simmons, Fourth Church organist and choirmaster for twenty-eight years and Fourth Church member. They were presented by him as his gift to the church. The sheaves of wheat in the panels symbolize Jesus as the bread of life, and the clusters of grapes reflect the atoning blood of Christ. These panels honor the ministry of Joanna Adams, just as the upper chancel seat cushions, also the work of Morgan Simmons, honor the ministries of Fourth Church pastors John Timothy Stone, Harrison Ray Anderson, Elam Davies, and John M. Buchanan.

**The Fourth Church stained-glass windows**, depicted on the bulletin cover, were designed by Charles J. Connick of Boston. The north and south sanctuary windows were made in the thirteenth-century manner known as grisaille.

**The anthem "See What Love"** is from the oratorio *St. Paul*, Felix Mendelssohn's first large-scale choral work (written between 1834 and 1836).

**The Vespers "Call to Worship" and "Prayer of Praise"** are from *All the Seasons of Mercy* by Diane Karay.

# BAPTISM AT FOURTH PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH

*“Let the little children come to me . . .  
for it is to such as these that the kingdom of heaven belongs.”  
Matthew 19:14 (NRSV)*

On the second Sunday of each month, Fourth Church includes the Sacrament of Baptism in morning worship. Baptism is the sign and seal of God’s grace and covenant in Christ. As *The Book of Order* of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) explains, baptism signifies the faithfulness of God, the washing away of sin, rebirth, putting on the fresh garment of Christ, and adoption into the covenant family of the church.

The baptism of children witnesses to the truth that God’s love claims people before they are able to respond in faith. The congregation, on behalf of the whole church, assumes responsibility for nurturing the baptized children in the Christian life, and it is for this reason that the congregation makes such a promise during the service.

In the unison prayer we also remember that we too were baptized and as children of God are part of the worldwide family of faith.
