

The Great West Window (left portion)

WINDOWS BY CHARLES J. CONNICK



In the top left panel, angels look down toward the Christ figure in the center window with the words, “Amen. Blessing and glory and wisdom and thanksgiving” (Revelation 7:12).

The central panel contains depictions of different races—a missionary with an open Bible, people from Asia, and a kneeling Ethiopian—with the words, “Go ye therefore, and teach all nations” (Matthew 28:19).

The bottom panel depicts Moses holding the two tablets of the law and has the inscription “Consecrate yourselves today unto the Lord even every man” (Exodus 32:29).
