Worship Notes

- Today is Trinity Sunday, the day when the church celebrates the mystery of God as Three in One: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit; one God who is Creator, Redeemer, and Comforter.
- George Stone, son of John Timothy Stone, who was Pastor of Fourth Presbyterian Church from 1909 to 1930, is serving as Beadle at both 9:30 and 11:00 worship this morning as part of Fourth Church's recognition of the 50th anniversary of John Timothy Stone's death. Each Sunday, a member of the congregation serves in the role of Beadle, carrying the Bible in the opening procession.
- The textile banners and pulpit parament were created by Laurie Wohl.
- The special 90th Anniversary Offering, celebrating 90 years on Michigan Avenue, supports Fourth Church's vision for the future, Project Light—in particular the refurbishing and releading of the 90-year-old stained glass windows. Gifts can be made to this offering by using the 90th Anniversary envelopes in the pew racks or by writing "90th Anniversary" on the memo line of a check made payable to Fourth Presbyterian Church.
- Today's prelude at 9:30 and 11:00, the Fugue in E-flat Major is nicknamed "St. Anne" because Bach borrows the hymn tune by that name as the piece's theme. This hymn tune was written about fifteen years before Bach wrote his fugue. The three towering sections of the fugue each represent an aspect of the Trinity.
- Fourth Church expresses its thanks and appreciation to the Chancel Choir for providing music leadership during 8:00 worship this year. This choir will be on summer break until September.
