The bread and wine of Communion remind us of the pivotal point of Christianity: God poured out his life into the life of a human being, and thereby—since we are all connected to one another, whether we like it or not—into the lives of all human beings. The Logos of God, as the Gospel of John so bluntly puts it, “became Flesh.” But what is so frequently overlooked by all churches is that the flesh into which the heart of God was poured was not just any flesh, it was—as the great theologian Karl Barth reminds us—Jewish flesh. This means that if we Christians are in some way linked to Jesus Christ, we are thereby united to one who lived and died a Jew.
