

Worship Notes

- Today's prelude was originally an orchestral concerto written by Antonio Vivaldi. Johann Sebastian Bach transcribed this arrangement for the organ in 1713.

The detail on the bulletin cover is taken from one of Fourth Presbyterian Church's aisle windows. Designed by Charles J. Connick of Boston, these stained-glass windows on the north and south sides of the sanctuary were made in the thirteenth-century style known as grisaille.
