Highly intelligent people often have reservations about the Bible. Without question, honest uncertainty beats hard-nosed certitude. But it is a mistake to be paralyzed by unceratinty, especially when life so frequently calls upon us to act wholeheartedly without absolute certainty. Moreover, wrestling with Scripture, far from a sign of weakness, is a reflection of religious faithfulness. What else should you struggle with if not the Bible? What struggle offers more reward?

BAPTISM AT FOURTH PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH

On the second Sunday of each month, Fourth Church includes the Sacrament of Baptism in morning worship. Baptism is the sign and seal of God's grace and covenant in Christ.
