T he love story in which we live is essentially a mystery. We don't know and can't know the mind of God. . . . We can know enough. We have God's self-revelation in Jesus Christ; we have the testimonies of generations of saints who have witnessed and participated in miracles that brook no rational explanation. We have the moments in our own faith journeys when a veil lifts and we are, as C. S. Lewis put it, "surprised by Joy;" we have the whisperings of the Spirit and the small epiphanies of daily life that remind us that we are accompanied, embraced, and held.



Fourth Presbyterian Church Sanctuary Improvements

The sanctuary enhancements being undertaken as part of Project Light are underway. This past week, crews removed the ninety-two-year old pews from the worship space and installed a temporary sound system. In the week ahead, workers will begin to remove the flooring under the chairs in preparation for the installation of new flooring (the aisle flooring will remain as is).

This sanctuary improvement project includes the installation of a new sound system, new flooring under the pews, and new pews, which will be exact replicas of the pews that were installed in 1914, down to the detailed end carvings. The new pews also will provide improved ergonomics as well as greater access for those with disabilities.

During this construction phase, the pipe organ has been wrapped and sealed to protect it from dust. A temporarily installed electronic organ will is being used in its place.

Due to the interest expressed in obtaining original pews, an expanded but limited number of them will be available through the auction at the Mission Benefit on February 24. There also will be a limited number of pew ends available through the auction. Information about ordering small wooden crosses, made from the wood from some of the pews, will be available in the weeks ahead.
