

Fourth Presbyterian Church Sanctuary Improvements

The sanctuary enhancements being undertaken as part of Project Light are underway. This past week, crews removed the old flooring that was under the pews in preparation for the installation of new flooring (the aisle flooring will remain as is).

For your safety, please be careful not to catch your heels in the open grills of the heating registers below your feet.

This sanctuary improvement project includes the installation of a new sound system, new flooring under the pews, and new pews, which will be exact replicas of the pews that were installed in 1914, down to the detailed end carvings. The new pews also will provide improved ergonomics as well as greater access for those with disabilities.

During this construction phase, the pipe organ has been wrapped and sealed to protect it from dust. A temporarily installed electronic organ is being used in its place.

A limited number of original pews and original pew ends will be available through the auction at the Mission Benefit on February 24. Bids can be placed during Coffee Hour beginning today. Information about ordering small wooden crosses, made from the wood from some of the pews, will be available in the weeks ahead.
