#### Worship Notes

The new pews were installed in the sanctuar y this past week as part of the Project Light sanctuary improvements. The new cushions for the pews will be delivered in June. In the weeks ahead, final testing will be done on the sound system and final speakers installed. In the meantime, a temporary sound system, with temporary speakers, will continue to be used during worship along with the temporary electric organ, which is being used while the pipe organ remains sealed to protect it during this installation phase.

John Rutter conducted the premiere of his *Mass of the Children* in Carnegie Hall on February 13, 2003. This music is wedded to the ancient text of the mass, the Kyrie, Gloria, Sanctus, and Agnus Dei and to poetry by Thomas Ken, William Blake, Lancelot Andrewes, and St. Patrick.

Representative pieces from that collection are currently on display in the Loggia.
