Abraham Lincoln had it right. Our task should not be to invoke religion and the name of God by claiming God's blessing and endorsement for all our national policies and practices—saying in effect, that God is on our side. Rather, Lincoln said, we should pray and worry earnestly whether we are on God's side. . . . God's politics is never partisan or ideological. But it challenges everything about our politics. God's politics reminds us of the people our politics always neglects—the poor, the vulnerable, the left behind. God's politics challenges narrow, ethnic, economic, or cultural self-interest, reminding us of a much wider world and the creative diversity of all those made in the image of the creator.


