Worship Notes

The Chicago Lights Annual Fund Appeal continues today. Johann Sebastian Bach arranged Antonio Vivaldi's *Concerto in A Minor, this morning's prelude*, from its original orchestral score into a version for the organ around 1715. Bach was living in Weimar at the time and was profoundly influenced by the popular Italian style of writing.

The text for the closing hymn, "Startle Us, God," was commissioned by Fourth Presbyterian Church in honor of the twentieth anniversary of John Buchanan's ministry in Chicago in September 2005.

The bulletin cover: Since the church building was dedicated in May 1914, more than six million worshipers have passed under this twelve-foot wide tympanum over the Michigan Avenue entrance. The carving depicts Aaron blessing the children of Israel as he was instructed by God (Numbers 6:22–27).
