The "Image of God" is neither male nor female. . . . Paul says that in Christ there is neither male nor female. The positive way of knowing, on the other hand, affirms that there is in God both the masculine and the feminine. There is a mother's heart at the heart of God, as well as a father's. The prophet Isaiah compares God's love to a mother's when he asks: "Can a woman forget her nursing child?" . . . In essence, God is neither male nor female but in his theophanies God is both. And so it is to both that we may look in our search to know more of the Unknowable.



# BAPTISM AT FOURTH PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH

"Let the little children come to me . . . for it is to such as these that the kingdom of heaven belongs."

Matthew 19:14 (NRSV)

On the second Sunday of each month, Fourth Church includes the Sacrament of Baptism in morning worship. Baptism is the sign and seal of God's grace and covenant in Christ. Fanny Mendelssohn, composer of today's 9:30 and 11:00 postlude, was the oldest of four children and considered more talented than her younger brother, Felix. Her family was opposed to her musical career, but after she was married in 1829, her husband encouraged her to publish her music. Fanny's pursuit of music received Felix's blessing in 1846, the year before she died.

The hymn text "Lord of All Hopefulness" was written by Jan Struther (1901–1953) and is reprinted from *Enlarged Songs of Praise* (Oxford University Press).

The bulletin cover: Since the church building was dedicated in May 1914, more than six million worshipers have passed under this twelve-foot wide tympanum over the Michigan Avenue entrance. The carving depicts Aaron blessing the children of Israel as he was instructed by God (Numbers 6:22–27).
