

Worship Notes

- **The children being baptized at the 11:00 service are** Lucas Joseph Campanella, son of Franco and Tara Campanella; Sabrina Janet Daniels, daughter of Stephen and Gabriella Daniels; Maggie Smith Edmonds, daughter of Anthony and Jennifer Edmonds; and Dylan Clark Pepper, son of Bryan and JoAnn Pepper.
- "O Sons and Daughters, Let Us Sing," heard at the beginning of worship this morning, is based on a fifteenth-century French melody. It was published in Paris in 1623 and appeared in a hymnal in America in 1787. The French composer Jean François Dandrieu (1684–1740) used the melody in his elaborate arrangement heard in today's prelude.
- In an investiture ceremony on April 14, 2007, John Buchanan became a laureate of the Lincoln Academy of Illinois, which recognizes citizens who, by their achievements, have brought honor to the state.
- **Fourth Presbyterian Church's windows**, shown on the bulletin cover, were designed by Charles Connick of Boston and made using the thirteenth-century technique known as grisaille. Rather than using colored glass in figurative representations, grisaille windows are known for their lacy patterns painted onto light-colored glass.
