The overwhelming impression I had after looking at the new images generated from the Hubble telescope was one of awe and wonder and the feeling that we are not alone. . . . The more we look at this evidence of the basic structure of the universe, the more it appears to scientists and others that there is indeed some hand that guided us into existence. . . . I am still awed by the images from deep space; there is a sense of majesty that is profound, almost beyond comprehension. I sense the presence of God, but it is in the details that I find more comprehensible information about the nature of God.


