



The composer of this morning's prelude, Leo Sowerby, was one of the most prominent American liturgical composers of the twentieth century. After serving as Associate Organist at Fourth Presbyterian Church, he spent most of his career at St. James Cathedral here in Chicago. The prelude, "Requiescat in Pace," is in variation form and uses the chromaticism that characterizes so much of Sowerby's work.

Fourth Church offers a variety of weekly worship opportunities in addition to Sunday morning services. A Vespers Communion service is held at 6:30 p.m. each Sunday evening. Each weekday morning, Morning Prayer is held in Stone Chapel (9:30 a.m. on Monday, Wednesday, Thursday, Friday; 9:00 a.m. on Tuesday).

The textile banners and pulpit parament, "Unweavings" created by Laurie Wohl, were commissioned by Fourth Church for use during the liturgical season of Ordinary Time, the longest season of the church year (the season between Epiphany and Lent and between Pentecost and Advent). Through their combination of scripture texts and image, these banners celebrate and elevate the perception of the sacred in the "ordinary" as we make our faith journey day to day.

On the cover: The colorful arched ceiling high above the north balcony depicts angels, doves, grapes, and other biblical images. The large canvases were hand-cleaned by professional art restorers during the sanctuary renovation in 1994.
