My faith in God is not a product of ignorance, superstition, wild hope, or wishful thinking, but I have felt loved by a concerned and caring holy being greater than my imagination. And I have had my experience confirmed by thousands who have gone on before me, jotting a record of their encounters on rolls of papyrus, or locating the site of their theophanies by piling stones in the desert. And if my faith in God has more base in emotion and intuition than in logic, I'm frankly untroubled—for as Pascal noted, "It is the heart that perceives God and not the reason."







This morning's offertory anthem was written by Amy Beach, who was born in New Hampshire in 1867 and toured through Germany just prior to World War I as a gifted concert pianist and composer. The influence of German composer Richard Wagner is evident in the anthem, "Let This Mind Be in You," with its highly chromatic and dramatic writing.

The bulletin cover depicts seeds of new life, in the form of acorns. This hand-carved stone on the north wall of the chancel dates from 1914, the year of Fourth Church's construction. During this Annual Appeal season, we are mindful that the gifts we offer plant seeds of new life in this congregation and the communities it serves through worship, education and discipleship, and mission and service.
