During Today's Worship

- A church tour begins at 12:15 p.m., starting at the back of the sanctuary.
- Parking is available Sundays at the John Hancock Center, 875 North Michigan Avenue (access Chestnut Street), at the rate of \$7.00 for three hours and at 900 North Michigan (access from Rush or Walton Street) at the rate of \$7.75 to 4:00 p.m. and \$6.00 after 5:00 p.m. Validation tickets for 900 parking must be picked up during Coffee Hour or from the Chestnut Street reception desk. Hancock tickets must be validated in the Narthex, at the back of the sanctuary.



WORSHIP NOTES

- **Today's Minute for Mission** is presented by Sylvia Decker (9:30) and Rebecca Nilsson (11:00) on behalf of the Deacons' Care of Creation Committee.
- **The Native American piece heard in today's prelude,** "Many and Great, O God, Are Thy Ways," was sung by the Dakota. Joseph Renville (1779–1846), who was half Dakota and half French, heard it and included it in a hymnal he edited in 1842 called *Dakota Odowan*.
- This new bulletin cover design, like the seventeen-year-old cover design that it replaces, exclusively features photographs taken at Fourth Church. In the spirit of financial and environmental stewardship, the new bulletins and the "News and Opportunities" inserts have been reconfigured to effect cost savings while utilizing recyclable paper that contains recycled post-consumer waste and is acid free. The printing is done with inks having low volatile organic compounds and formulated with soy and vegetable oils. All bulletins and inserts left in the baskets by the doors are recycled.
