BAPTISM AT FOURTH PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH

E ACH SECOND SUNDAY OF THE MONTH, Fourth Church includes the Sacrament of Baptism in morning worship. Baptism is the sign and seal of God's grace and covenant in Christ.
