

When the shepherds left their flocks and brought the angels' words through the lowly doorway to the mother and her child, the heavenly servants continued to sing in the starry expanse, kept the heavens ringing, "Peace, peace on earth!" Since the angels thus sang, O, how many bloody deeds have been committed in strife by armed men on wild horses. O, how many holy nights has the chorus of spirits fearfully sung, urgently imploring, and softly accusing, "Peace, peace on earth!" Still it is an eternal hope that the weak shall not forever fall prey to every bold murderous act. Something like justice moves and acts through murder and horror, and it will build a kingdom that will seek for peace on earth. Slowly it will form itself, its sacred charge to carry out. Forging nonviolent weapons, flaming swords for the righteous, a line of strong people will arise whose bright trumpets shall sound forth, "Peace, peace on earth!"

Today's Christmas Cantata, "Friede auf Erden," was written in 1907 by Arnold Schönberg in a late-romantic style full of harmonic experimentation. The text was chosen by Schönberg because of his commitment to peace and justice. The text returns to the song the angels sang on Christmas night, "Peace, peace on earth." But rather than being a sentimental version of that angelic song, "Friede auf Erden" considers how hard and elusive that peace really is and challenges listeners to seek justice where it is not found, to bring peace on earth in and through their lives.

John Buchanan's Advent sermons have been based on favorite Advent hymns and Christmas carols. His Christmas Eve sermon will be based on "Come to Bethlehem and see" (Angels We Have Heard on High).
