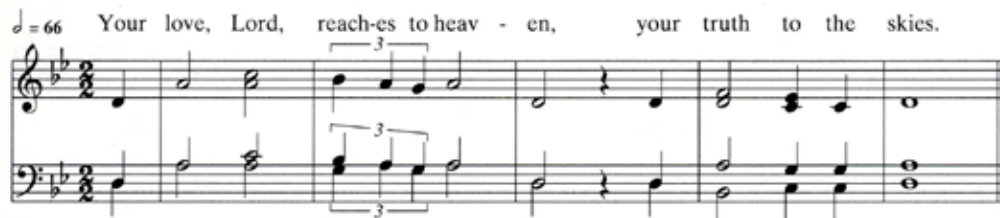



## WORSHIP NOTES

**This morning, Communion is served by intinction.** The congregation will come forward by the center aisle to receive the bread, which they will then dip into the chalice of grape juice. Worshipers will return to their pews by the side aisles. All who confess Jesus Christ as Savior and Lord are invited to partake of the Lord's Supper.

**The hymn "Lift Every Voice and Sing,"** based on the poem written by James Weldon Johnson for a 1900 celebration of Lincoln's birthday that was attended by Booker T. Washington, later became the anthem of the civil rights movement.

**The textile banners and pulpit parament,** "Unweavings" created by Laurie Wohl, were commissioned by Fourth Church for use during the liturgical season of Ordinary Time, the longest season of the church year (the season between Epiphany and Lent and between Pentecost and Advent). Through their combination of scripture texts and image, these banners celebrate and elevate the perception of the sacred in the "ordinary" as we make our faith journey day to day.
