A congregational meeting has been called by the Session of Fourth Church for Sunday, September 19 at 12:00 noon. The purpose of the meeting will be to hear and act on a recommendation from the Project Second Century Steering Committee, which has been working on a proposal for (a) a new building to be built in the space currently occupied by the parking lot, Westminster House, and the Counseling Center and (b) a capital campaign to fund such a project.
