

Baptism

at Fourth Presbyterian Church

On the second Sunday of each month, Fourth Church includes the Sacrament of Baptism in morning worship. Baptism is the sign and seal of God's grace and covenant in Christ. As *The Book of Order* of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) explains, baptism signifies the faithfulness of God, the washing away of sin, rebirth, putting on the fresh garment of Christ, and adoption into the covenant family of the church. The baptism of children witnesses to the truth that God's love claims people before they are able to respond in faith. The congregation, on behalf of the whole church, assumes responsibility for nurturing the baptized children in the Christian life, and it is for this reason that the congregation makes such a promise during the service. In the unison prayer we also remember that we too were baptized and as children of God are part of the worldwide family of faith.

WORSHIP NOTES

Fourth Church welcomes the Phoenix Children's Chorus and thanks them for their musical leadership during the 9:30 and 11:00 worship services this morning. Based in Phoenix, Arizona, the choir is celebrating its 25th season and serves more than 225 students in grades 2 through 12. The choir is directed by Ron Carpenter and Jaque Marum.

The Day of Pentecost celebrates the birth of the church and the giving of the Holy Spirit to the disciples of Jesus. Red, which is the liturgical color for the day, symbolizes the pentecostal fire of the Holy Spirit, as described in Acts 2. In the Jewish tradition, Pentecost (for "fifty" days after Passover) is a harvest festival of first fruits that also celebrates the giving of the Torah, or Hebrew law. The banners hanging in the sanctuary present both Old Testament and New Testament Pentecost themes, including creation, Hebrew law, harvest, Passover, and tongues of fire. In addition to being depicted as tongues of fire, the Holy Spirit is also often represented as a dove, drawing on the Gospel references to the Spirit of God descending on Jesus "like a dove" at the time of his baptism (Matthew 3:15, Mark 1:9, Luke 3:22).
