## **Advent Candle Lighting**

Instead of lighting a traditional Advent Wreath, during the Sundays of Advent the congregation is invited to come forward and light a prayer candle of their own. Your candle may signify something special that you are waiting for during this season, a confession of sin, someone you are holding in prayer, a joy or a concern, an openness to listen for God's voice, or anything that you feel moved to offer.

# **During Today's Worship**

All, including children, are invited to the Lord's Table to receive Communion, which is served by intinction. The congregation will come forward by the center aisle to receive the bread (gluten-free bread is available in the paper "cup" within the basket of bread), which they will then dip into the chalice of nonalcoholic grape juice. Worshipers will return to their pews by the side aisles.
