Antiphon: Psalm 142:1 (*sung by the congregation*)

Leader: Great and wondrous God, on this day we hear the story of Jesus' resurrection and celebrate his victory over sin and death. Yet we confess that fear and doubt still linger in our hearts and minds. We are people of the world, looking for signs of your glory. We believe, God. Help our unbelief.

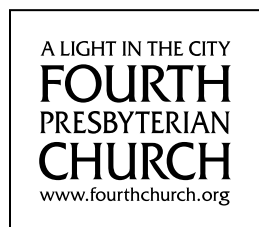

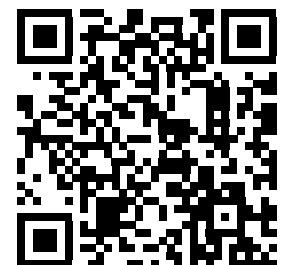
Pastor Nominating Committee

Worshipers will return to their pews by the side aisles.
