

WORSHIP NOTES

Fourth Church welcomes to the pulpit today James Forbes Jr., Senior Minister Emeritus of the Riverside Church. Consistently recognized as one of the most effective preachers in the English-speaking world, Dr. Forbes was the first African American to serve as Senior Minister of the interdenominational, interracial, and international Riverside Church in New York City. He is also co-chair of A Partnership of Faith, an interfaith organization of clergy among New York's Protestant, Catholic, Jewish, and Muslim communities.

The textile banners and pulpit parament, "Unweavings," created by Laurie Wohl, were commissioned by Fourth Church for use during the liturgical season of Ordinary Time, the longest season of the church year (the season between Epiphany and Lent and between Pentecost and Advent). Through their combination of scripture texts and images, these banners celebrate and elevate the perception of the sacred in the "ordinary" as we make our faith journey day to day.

About the cover: At Fourth Church, a white rose is placed in the chancel whenever a member of the congregation dies. The cover photograph of one of these roses thus symbolizes all those whom we remember on this All Saints' Sunday.
