

FEBRUARY 3 AT 9:30 AND 11:00 A.M.

The Reverend Dr. Allan Aubrey Boesak is one of the heroes of the anti-apartheid freedom struggle in South Africa. He and Archbishop Desmond Tutu led the United Democratic Front (UDF), which brought together more than 700 organizations from all communities, becoming the first nonracial movement and the main force behind the anti-apartheid activities during the decisive decade of the 1980s. Dr. Boesak, whom Archbishop Tutu has called the most powerful orator ever produced by South Africa, is a pastor in the Uniting Reformed Church and served as president of the World Alliance of Reformed Churches.

Lauren Artress, an Episcopal priest, spiritual director, and psychotherapist, is considered responsible for sparking the reemergence of labyrinth awareness. She has written several books and articles on the subject and travels extensively offering workshops and lectures on the use of the labyrinth, including a pilgrimage held annually at Chartres Cathedral in France. On Saturday, February 16, she will be leading the Lenten/Midwinter Retreat “Strength for the Journey: The Labyrinth as a Path to Ourselves” at Fourth Church.
