


Welcoming Guest Preachers—this Lent

Lauren Artress, an Episcopal priest, spiritual director, and psychotherapist, is considered responsible for sparking the reemergence of labyrinth awareness. She has written several books and articles on the subject—including Walking a Sacred Path: Rediscovering the Labyrinth as a Spiritual Tool—and travels extensively offering workshops and lectures on the use of the labyrinth, including a pilgrimage held annually at Chartres Cathedral in France. Yesterday she led our Midwinter Lenten Retreat using the new labyrinth in Buchanan Chapel, which will be available for walking after the 11:00 service today.
