## **Prayer of Confession**

## Antiphon (Psalm 142:1, sung by the congregation)

Leader: Gracious God, we come before you asking forgiveness, because we have not been the people you have created us to be. You created us to trust you, but we rely only on ourselves. You created us to serve you, but we are selfish. You created us to love our neighbors, but we see one another as strangers. Forgive us, Lord.

## Antiphon

Leader: Loving God, through the life of Jesus, you called us to be a people of love, but we have not heard your call. You create us for life together, but we isolate ourselves with our fear and anxiety. You create us for generosity toward others, but mostly we worry about what we might lose. You show us the meaning of love that takes risks, but we build up our defenses. Forgive us, Lord.

## **During Today's Worship**

All are encouraged to use the prayer card, found in this worship bulletin, to offer joys and/or concerns. The cards will be collected during the Sharing of Gifts (simply place the card in the offering plate as it is passed). The prayers will then be incorporated into this afternoon's Prayers of the People.

If you have a prayer you would rather not share during worship, you are invited to complete a prayer card found by one of the prayer boxes in the Narthex, at the back of the Sanctuary, and it will be passed on to Judy Watt, Associate Pastor for Pastoral Care.

All, including children, are invited to the Lord's Table to receive Communion, which is served by intinction. The congregation will come forward by the center aisle to receive the bread (gluten-free bread is available in the paper "cup" within the basket of bread), which they will then dip into the chalice of nonalcoholic grape juice. Worshipers will return to their pews by the side aisles.

The large banners hanging in the middle of the Sanctuary were created by liturgical artist Shawna Bowman during the 4:00 worship service and are artistic representations of our worship experience.

Please turn off all cell phones when in the Sanctuary.

- Large-print Bibles and individual listening devices for improved sound are available in the back of the Sanctuary. Worship also can be heard through the "T" setting of hearing aids.
- **If your infant or small child needs care** during the worship service, you may leave the Sanctuary and return as you wish. There is also an area in the side aisle where your child can play quietly.
