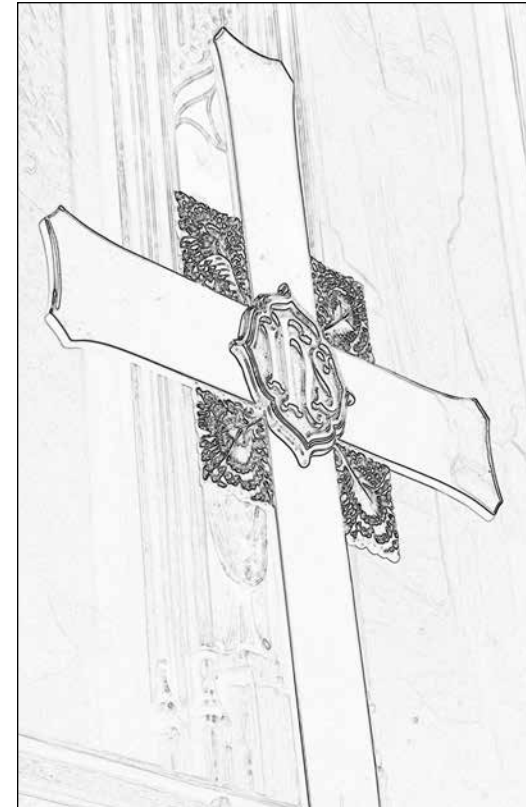

I go forth to die, suffer and die for you. See now, this is the  
appointed hour when the Son of man must be betrayed into  
the hands of evil men.

“Timor et tremor venerunt super me” *F. Poulenc*  
Great fear and trembling have taken hold of me; now  
darkness descends on me; heavy darkness overwhelms me.  
Be merciful to me, O Lord, for my soul has trusted in thee,  
trusted in thy mercy. Hear my prayer, O God, consider my  
supplication; for thou hast been my strength and my refuge,  
thou art my sure defense. Hear, O Lord, I call upon thee;  
let me never be confounded.

“Vinea mea electa” *F. Poulenc*  
Vine that I have loved as my own, I it was who planted  
thee, chose thee and planted thee; why is all sweetness  
turned to gall and bitterness? Why wouldst thou crucify me  
and take Barrabas in my place? I kept thee safe and took the  
hard stones away, took them from thy path and built a tower  
in thy defense.

“Tenebrae factae sunt” *F. Poulenc*  
Darkness fell upon the earth when he was crucified,  
and behold, at the ninth hour, crying out with a loud voice,  
Jesus exclaimed, “My God, my God, why hast thou forsaken  
me?” He bowed down his head, gave up his spirit,  
and he died.
