

WORSHIP NOTES

The anthems in this morning's service are from the *Requiem* by French composer and organist Maurice Duruflé. Duruflé composed this work in 1947 in memory of his father. The Morning Choir will be singing the entire *Requiem* this evening at 6:30 p.m. in the Sanctuary in a communion service of remembrance in memory of all departed loved ones.

The textile banners and pulpit parament, "Unweavings," created by Laurie Wohl, were commissioned by Fourth Church for use during the liturgical season of Ordinary Time, the longest season of the church year (the season between Epiphany and Lent and between Pentecost and Advent). Through their combination of scripture texts and images, these banners celebrate and elevate the perception of the sacred in the "ordinary" as we make our faith journey day to day.

About the cover: At Fourth Church, a white rose is placed in the chancel whenever a member of the congregation dies. The cover photograph of one of these roses thus symbolizes all those whom we remember on this All Saints' Sunday. The cover quote is from Luther's *Lectures on Galatians*, given in the year 1535.
