

WORSHIP NOTES

The Day of Pentecost celebrates the birth of the church and the giving of the Holy Spirit to the disciples of Jesus. Red, which is the liturgical color for the day, symbolizes the pentecostal fire of the Holy Spirit, as described in Acts 2. In the Jewish tradition, Pentecost (for "fifty" days after Passover) is a harvest festival of first fruits that also celebrates the giving of the Torah, or Hebrew law. The banners hanging in the Sanctuary present Old Testament and New Testament Pentecost themes, including creation, Hebrew law, harvest, Passover, and tongues of fire.

The red stoles worn by the pastors on Pentecost celebrate both the gift of the Holy Spirit that descended like tongues of fire and the call to carry God's love to all people. A liturgical symbol of ordination to the ministry of Word and Sacrament, the stoles recall the words of Jesus in Matthew 11:29—
"Take my yoke upon you"—by representing that yoke of service to Christ.

This morning, Communion is served by intinction. The congregation will come forward by the center aisle to receive the bread, which they will then dip into the chalice of grape juice. (Gluten-free bread is available in a small tumbler in each basket of bread.) Worshipers will return to their pews by the side aisles.
