## During Today's Worship

- Large-print bulletins, Bibles, and hymnals are available in the Narthex. Worship also can be heard through the "T" setting of hearing aids. Individual listening devices for improved sound are also available from ushers.
- If your infant or child needs care or becomes disruptive during the worship service, you may leave the Sanctuary and return as you wish.
