

BAPTIZED TODAY during the 9:30 a.m. service is Connor Christopher Bilton, child of Jonathan and Kristen Bilton.

Today we remember the Baptism of Our Lord, one of the texts traditionally read after Epiphany, when we continue to focus on the revelation of the divinity of Jesus. As we hear again the voice of the Lord saying at Jesus' baptism "You are my Son the Beloved; with you I am well pleased," we also recall our own baptism, in which God has claimed and named us as God's own. In grateful thanksgiving we together renew our commitment to live out our call as beloved children of God.
