Lent and Easter

Easter Brunch will be held next Sunday at 12:30 p.m. in Borwell Dining Room. Tickets are available at the reception desk today and during the week.

On Maundy Thursday, March 24, there will be a 12:10 p.m. Communion service as well as a 7:30 p.m. Tenebrae service, also with Communion. The Tenebrae service portrays the progression from light to darkness in the passion of Jesus.

On Good Friday, March 25, there will be a 12:10 p.m. service and, at 7:30 p.m., a choral service, featuring *Stabat Mater* by Francis Poulenc.

A Good Friday experience for children will be held on March 25 at 5:30 p.m. in Buchanan Chapel.

A Saturday Easter Vigil will be held on March 26 and will begin at 8:00 p.m. in the Michigan Avenue courtyard with the kindling of a fire to provide candlelight to carry into the darkened Sanctuary. Once inside there will be readings from scripture, a reaffirmation of baptismal vows, and the celebration of Communion.

"Im/migration: Stations of the Cross" will be present in Buchanan Chapel until Holy Saturday and offers opportunity for prayer and reflection this Lenten season.

During Today's Worship

If you have a prayer you would rather not share during worship, you are invited to complete a prayer card found by one of the prayer boxes in the Narthex, at the back of the Sanctuary, and it will be passed on to Judith Watt, Associate Pastor for Pastoral Care.

All, including children, are invited to the Lord's Table

to receive Communion, which is served by intinction. The congregation will come forward by the center aisle to receive the bread (gluten-free bread is available in the paper "cup" within the basket of bread), which they will then dip into the chalice of nonalcoholic grape juice. Worshipers will return to their pews by the side aisles.

The large banners hanging in the middle of the Sanctuary were created by liturgical artist Shawna Bowman during the 4:00 worship service and are artistic representations of our worship experience.

Please turn off all cell phones when in the Sanctuary.

Worship also can be heard through the "T" setting of hearing aids.

If your infant or small child needs care during the worship service, you may leave the Sanctuary and return as you wish. There is also an area in the left-side aisle where your child can play quietly.
