Holy Week and Easter

- Daily Holy Week devotions are available via email (sign up at www.bit.ly/fpcdevotions). They are also posted on Facebook (facebook.com/fourthchurch), Twitter (@FourthChicago), and the church website (www.fourthchurch.org) and are available in printed booklets in the literature racks.
- Maundy Thursday Communion services on April 13 will be held at 12:10 p.m. (Hardy Kim preaching) and 7:30 p.m. (Tenebrae) in the Sanctuary. The Tenebrae service portrays the progression from light to darkness in the passion of Jesus.
- On Good Friday, April 14, Rocky Supinger will preach at the 12:10 p.m. service. The 7:30 p.m. choral service will feature works by Allegri, Barber, and Whitacre sung by the Morning Choir.
- A Good Friday program for children will be held on April 14 at 5:30 p.m. in Buchanan Chapel.
- A Saturday Easter Vigil will be held on April 15 beginning at 8:00 p.m. in the Michigan Avenue courtyard with the kindling of a fire to provide candlelight to carry into the darkened Sanctuary. Once inside there will be readings from scripture, a reaffirmation of baptismal vows, and the celebration of Communion. Those attending are encouraged to bring bells to make a joyful noise in celebration of the resurrection.
- Easter Sunday services on April 16 will include a Sunrise Service at 6:30 a.m. at Oak Street Beach; 8:00, 9:30, and 11:30 a.m. worship; and a 4:00 p.m. jazz service. An Easter program for children will take place at 9:30 a.m. on Gratz Floor 4.
- Our Easter Brunch of ham, bacon, waffles, scrambled eggs, hash browns, fresh fruit, Danish, orange juice, and hot coffee and tea will be served Easter Sunday, April 16 at 12:30 p.m. in Borwell Dining Room. Tickets, which are required, are available online at www.bit.ly/fpcbrunch17

During Today's Worship

All are encouraged to use the prayer card, found in this worship bulletin, to offer joys and/or concerns. The cards will be collected during the Sharing of Gifts (simply place the card in the offering plate as it is passed). The prayers will then be read aloud during this afternoon's Prayers of the People.

If you have a prayer you would rather not share during worship, you are invited to complete a prayer card found by one of the prayer boxes in the Narthex, at the back of the Sanctuary, and it will be passed on to Judith Watt, Associate Pastor for Pastoral Care.

All, including children, are invited to the Lord's Table

to receive Communion, which is served by intinction. The congregation will come forward by the center aisle to receive the bread (gluten-free bread is available in the paper "cup" within the basket of bread), which they will then dip into the chalice of nonalcoholic grape juice. Worshipers will return to their pews by the side aisles.

The large banners hanging in the middle of the Sanctuary were created by liturgical artist Shawna Bowman during the 4:00 worship service and are artistic representations of our worship experience.

Please silence all electronic devices when in the Sanctuary.

Worship also can be heard through the "T" setting of hearing aids.

If your infant or small child needs care during the worship service, you may leave the Sanctuary and return as you wish. There is also an area in the left-side aisle where your child can play quietly.

Worship folders, containing quiet activities and a bulletin for children, are available from a greeter.
